New Selma facility better serves area residents with disabilities

SELMA – The Alabama Department of Rehabilitation Services (ADRS) will host an open house at its facility in downtown Selma on Wednesday, Nov. 30, from 10 a.m. to noon.

The 12,644 square-foot facility at 720 Alabama Ave., which opened its doors in December 2015, triples the size of the former office at the Easter Seals Complex on Citizen's Parkway. Both Children's Rehabilitation Service (CRS) and Vocational Rehabilitation Service (VRS) are housed together in the space, with CRS occupying approximately two-thirds of the facility.

"We are thrilled to be in our new facility in the heart of Selma," said CRS Office Coordinator Melvina Moss. "We put the people we serve first when we remodeled this historic building. It is functional, convenient and beneficial for the entire Selma community."

Selma's CRS clinic features an audiology booth, a modern exam and interview room, a parent resource area and covered rear entrance parking to protect consumers in motorized wheelchairs from poor weather conditions. VRS has a new conference room in addition to newly appointed office spaces.

The open house will feature tours of the facility.

The Alabama Department of Rehabilitation Services is the state agency whose mission is to enable Alabama's children and adults with disabilities to achieve their maximum potential.
