Event teaches job readiness skills to students with disabilities

DECATUR – With the U.S. economy in a recession, students with disabilities can use all the assistance they can get with finding a job.

“Got Jobs?” will help students with disabilities from the Cullman Area Career Center and Limestone County Area Vocational Technical Center locate jobs.

The workshop will be held Friday, Dec. 5, from 9:30 a.m. until noon.

The event is sponsored by the Decatur office of Vocational Rehabilitation Service and the North Alabama Governor’s Committee on Employment of People with Disabilities, programs of the Alabama Department of Rehabilitation Services.
